**ORDER TERMINATING SUSPENSION AND IMPOSING PROBATION**

On March 2, 2017, Ann K. Biser, PA-C (the “Respondent”) and Disciplinary Panel B (“Panel B”) of the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the “Board”), entered into a Consent Order in which Panel B suspended the Respondent’s physician assistant license for 30 days.<sup>1</sup> The 30 day suspension went into effect 10 business days after the March 2, 2017 Consent Order was executed. The Consent Order provided that, at the end of the 30 day suspension period, Panel B would administratively terminate the suspension and impose a period of probation for a minimum of two years with certain probationary terms and conditions. It is, thus, hereby

**ORDERED** that the **30 DAY SUSPENSION** imposed under the March 2, 2017, Consent Order is **TERMINATED**; and it is further

**ORDERED** that the Respondent is placed on **PROBATION** for a minimum period of **TWO (2) YEARS**.<sup>2</sup> During the probationary period, the Respondent shall comply with all of the following probationary terms and conditions:

1. Within six (6) months, the Respondent shall successfully complete a Board disciplinary panel-approved course in ethics. The Board disciplinary

panel will not accept a course taken over the Internet. The course may not be used to fulfill the continuing medical education credits required for license renewal. The Respondent must provide documentation to the Board that the Respondent has successfully completed the course; and

2. The Respondent shall comply with all laws governing the practice of medicine under the Maryland Physician Assistant Practice Act and all rules and regulations promulgated thereunder; and it is further

**ORDERED** that the Respondent shall not apply for the early termination of probation; and it is further

**ORDERED** that, after a minimum of **TWO (2) YEARS**, if the Respondent has fully and timely complied with the terms and conditions of probation, and there are no pending complaints related to the charges, the Board or Board Disciplinary Panel B will administratively terminate the probation. The administrative termination of probation will be issued through an order of the Board or Board panel; and it is further

**ORDERED** that if the Board or Panel B determines, after notice and an opportunity for a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge of the Office of Administrative Hearings if there is a genuine dispute as to a material fact or a show cause hearing before the Board or Panel B if there is no genuine dispute as to a material fact, that the Respondent has failed to comply with any term or condition of probation or this Consent Order, the Board or Panel B may reprimand the Respondent, place the Respondent on probation with appropriate terms and conditions, or suspend or revoke the Respondent's physician assistant license in Maryland. The Board or

Panel B may, in addition to one or more of the sanctions set forth above, impose a civil monetary fine upon the Respondent; and it is further

**ORDERED** that the Respondent is responsible for all costs incurred in fulfilling the terms and conditions of this Consent Order; and it is further

**ORDERED** that, unless stated otherwise in the order, any time period begins when the order goes into effect. This order goes into effect upon the signature of the Board's Executive Director, who signs on behalf of the Panel; and it is further

**ORDERED** that this is a **PUBLIC DOCUMENT** pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Gen. Prov. §§ 4-101-4-601 (2014).
