ORDER TERMINATING SUSPENSION AND IMPOSING PROBATION

As part of the terms of a Consent Order between Vickey K. Manning, PA-C (the "Respondent") and Disciplinary Panel B ("Panel B") of the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the "Board"), Panel B suspended Respondent's physician assistant license for 30 days. The Consent Order went into effect on January 24, 2017. The Consent Order states that Panel B would administratively terminate the suspension at the end of the 30 day suspension period and impose probation with certain probationary terms and conditions. It is, thus, hereby

ORDERED that the 30 DAY SUSPENSION imposed under the January 24, 2017, Consent Order is **TERMINATED**; and it is further

ORDERED that the Respondent is placed on **PROBATION** for a minimum period of **TWO (2) YEARS.**² During the probationary period, the Respondent shall comply with all of the following probationary terms and conditions:

1. Within six (6) months, the Respondent shall successfully complete a Board disciplinary panel-approved course in ethics, with emphasis on self-prescribing;

- 2. The Board disciplinary panel will not accept a course taken over the Internet. The course may not be used to fulfill the continuing medical education credits required for license renewal. The Respondent must provide documentation to the Board that the Respondent has successfully completed the course;
- 3. The Respondent shall provide a copy of the January 24, 2017, Consent Order to her primary supervisory physician within five (5) business days of commencing any employment. The Respondent shall ensure that her primary supervisory physician send confirmation of his/her receipt of the Consent Order to the Board; and it is further

ORDERED that if the Board or Panel B determines, after notice and an opportunity for a hearing before an Administrative Law Judge of the Office of Administrative Hearings if there is a genuine dispute as to a material fact or a show cause hearing before the Board or Panel B if there is no genuine dispute as to a material fact, that the Respondent has failed to comply with any term or condition of probation, the Board or Panel B may reprimand the Respondent, place the Respondent on probation with appropriate terms and conditions, or suspend or revoke the Respondent's license to practice as a physician assistant in Maryland. The Board or Panel B may, in addition to one or more of the sanctions set forth above, impose a civil monetary fine upon the Respondent; and it is further

ORDERED that, after a minimum period of TWO (2) YEARS, the Respondent may submit a written petition to the Board requesting termination of probation. After consideration of the petition, the probation may be terminated through an order of the Board or Panel B. The Respondent may be required to appear before the Board or Panel B to discuss her petition for termination. The Board or Panel B will grant the

petition to terminate the probation if the Respondent has fully and satisfactorily complied with all of the probationary terms and conditions and there are no pending complaints related to the charges; and it is further

ORDERED that the Respondent is responsible for all costs incurred in fulfilling the terms and conditions of this Order; and it is further

ORDERED that, unless stated otherwise in the order, any time period prescribed in this order begins when this Order goes into effect. This Order goes into effect upon the signature of the Board's Executive Director, who signs on behalf of Panel B; and it is further

ORDERED that this Order is a public document pursuant to Md. Code Ann., Gen. Prov. §§ 4–101 *et seq.*
