ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION

On March 16, 2016, Disciplinary Panel B of the Maryland State Board of Physicians and Lawrence Vidaver, M.D. entered into a Consent Order to resolve charges against Dr. Vidaver. Under the Consent Order, Dr. Vidaver was reprimanded, placed on probation for a minimum period of eighteen months with certain terms and conditions, and permanently prohibited from practicing pain management and prescribing opioid medications to chronic pain patients.¹ Dr. Vidaver has successfully complied with the probationary terms and conditions and more than eighteen months has passed. It is thus hereby

ORDERED that the probation imposed under the March 16, 2016, Consent Order, is **TERMINATED**; and it is further

ORDERED that the reprimand remains in effect; and it is further

ORDERED that the permanent condition in the Consent Order, which prohibits Dr. Vidaver from practicing pain management and prescribing opioid medications to chronic pain patients, but permits Dr. Vidaver to prescribe opioids, in emergency situations for acute pain, for seven days or fewer, remains in effect; and it is further
