Dear Dr. Mullings and Counsel:

On February 14, 2011, the Board issued an **ORDER FOR SUMMARY SUSPENSION OF LICENSE TO PRACTICE MEDICINE** (“Order”) in this case. Dr. Mullings was given an opportunity to attend a post-deprivation hearing on that issue within 15 days of the Order on February 23, 2011. Dr. Mullings attended the hearing on that date. The State was represented by Dawn L. Rubin, Esq. Administrative Prosecutor.

After considering the presentations at the hearing, the Board determined that it would not lift the summary suspension first imposed on February 14, 2011. The Board concluded that the arguments submitted and the responses to the Board's questions did not significantly change the Board's findings or conclusions regarding the danger to the public which would be posed by Dr. Mullings practicing medicine at this time. The Board advised Dr. Mullings of this decision orally on the hearing date.

Under the Board regulations, you have the right to request a full evidentiary hearing before an Administrative Law Judge. This request will be granted if the Board receives a written request for the hearing within ten days of the date of this letter. Any request for a hearing should be sent to Yemisi Koya, M.D. Chief, Compliance Investigations, at the Board's address. If you request such a hearing, the regulations require that an


