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CONSENT ORDER

In or around November 2024, the Maryland State Board of Physicians (the "Board") initiated an investigation of **MOHAMMAD KHALID**, **M.D.**, License Number D43496, after receiving information that he had issued prescriptions during a period in which his medical license was expired. At the conclusion of its investigation, Panel A determined that it has grounds to charge the Respondent with failing to comply with provisions of the Maryland Medical Practice Act (the "Act"), Md. Code Ann., Health Occ. ("Health Occ.") §§ 14-101 et seq. (2021 Repl. Vol. & 2024 Supp.).

The pertinent provisions of the Act are as follows:

Health Occ. § 14-601. Practicing Without License

Except as otherwise provided in this title:

(1) A person may not practice, attempt to practice, or offer to practice medicine in the State unless licensed by the Board

Prior to the issuance of disciplinary charges, the Respondent agreed to enter into this Consent Order, consisting of Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Order, and Consent.

FINDINGS OF FACT

Panel A finds the following facts:

- 1. At all times relevant, the Respondent was and is licensed to practice medicine in the State of Maryland. The Respondent initially was licensed to practice medicine in Maryland on July 6, 1992, under License Number D43496. The Respondent's license expired on September 30, 2024, and was reinstated on November 20, 2024. The current license is active and expires on September 30, 2026, subject to renewal.
- 2. The Respondent is board-certified in Internal Medicine, and at all times relevant, practiced medicine at a private medical office located in Montgomery County, Maryland.
- 3. On or about October 15, 2024, the Respondent submitted an application to reinstate his medical license.
- 4. Between around October 1, 2024, and November 19, 2024, while his application for reinstatement was pending and his license remained expired, the Respondent issued approximately 69 prescriptions to patients from his private practice located in Montgomery County.
- 5. On or about November 12, 2024, the Board received a call from a pharmacy inquiring about the status of the Respondent's license after receiving a prescription issued by the Respondent, who stated that his licensure issue had been resolved.

- 6. Upon review of the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) and related pharmacy records, the Board confirmed that the Respondent had actively prescribed controlled substances during the period his license was expired.
- 7. The Board's investigation revealed that the Respondent practiced medicine in the State of Maryland without a valid license by issuing prescriptions over the course of approximately seven weeks, prior to the reinstatement of his license on November 20, 2024.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact, Panel A concludes as a matter of law that the Respondent practiced medicine in the State of Maryland without a valid license between October 1, 2024, and November 19, 2024, which constitutes a violation of Health Occ. § 14-601(1).

ORDER

It is, on the affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum of Panel A, hereby:

ORDERED that, within one year from the effective date of this Consent Order, the Respondent shall pay a civil fine of TWO THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$2,500). The payment shall be by bank certified check or money order made payable to the Maryland Board of Physicians, P.O. Box 37217, Baltimore, Maryland 21297. The Board will not renew or reinstate the Respondent's license if the Respondent fails to pay the fine; and it is further

ORDERED that the effective date of the Consent Order is the date the Consent Order is signed by the Executive Director of the Board or her designee. The Executive Director or her designee signs the Consent Order on behalf of the disciplinary panel which has imposed the terms and conditions of this Consent Order; and it is further

ORDERED that this Consent Order is a public document. See Health Occ. §§ 1-607, 14-411.1(b)(2) and Gen. Prov. § 4-333(b)(6) (2024 Repl. Vol.).

I voluntarily enter into and agree to comply with the terms and conditions set forth in this Consent Order as a resolution of the pending disciplinary matters. I waive any right to contest the Findings of Fact and the Conclusions of Law set out in this Consent Order. I

waive all right to appeal this Consent Order.

I sign this Consent Order without reservation, and I fully understand and comprehend the language and meaning of its terms.
